The vote that was held at the State Convention to eliminate the rotating council chair format did not pass. There were only 243 Lions that voted. 43 of those were for the elimination, while the other 200 voted to continue our current council structure. This means that during the Lion's year of 2028-2029, District 14-E will hold the council chair position.

Each club is now inducting their officers and passing the torch off to their next leader. Just remember the pride you felt when you took your oath. With being the "past" DG, President, or any other office, you are still a Lion. Don't forget the passion that you had when you joined. Ask where you are needed, maybe serve on a committee that you grew to appreciate and now have time for. Be an active LION.

These past three years serving you as a VDG and then DG, has given me hope that our district is in great and capable hands for many years to come. I had great support these years from my beautiful wife, friends, and new acquaintances. Without you this would be a much more difficult and demanding year.
